
Down the Drain?





Everything we put down the drain affects the rivers and oceans around us. Water from our homes flows through pipes to treatment plants before it is released into local waterways.





Did you know?



Preventing clogs helps the environment too. Clogs can damage equipment at water treatment plants and lead to overflows.



Some chemicals do not break down in water treatment plants. They make it into our bays and rivers, where they can be toxic to wildlife.

Microplastics from contact lenses and labels can get into the ocean and eventually our food supply.



Running cold water down the garbage disposal helps keep things from melting and then solidifying later in the pipes.

Many storm drains go straight into our local waterways. Even pet waste can carry disease and cause harm to wildlife.
